Concussion Recovery Assessment of New Zealanders in Adolescence and Childhood



We are recruiting families of children and youth (age 5-17 years) who have had a concussion or mild TBI in the last ten days to take part in a study

#### What will you have to do?

Parents/Guardians and children/youth will be asked questions about their health, feelings and behaviour, and usual activities. We would like to talk to you soon after the injury, then at 1 month, 3 months, and 6 months to find out about your recovery. We can talk to you on the phone, on zoom, or in person.

Each participating family will be given a \$20 voucher for each assessment in appreciation of your time.


