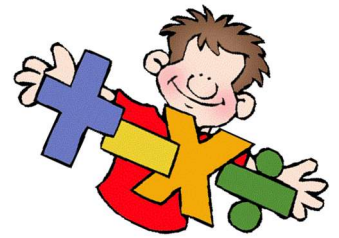

Year 7: Ethan, Navroop, Ekamjot, and Anika.

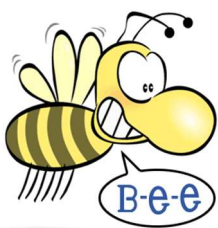

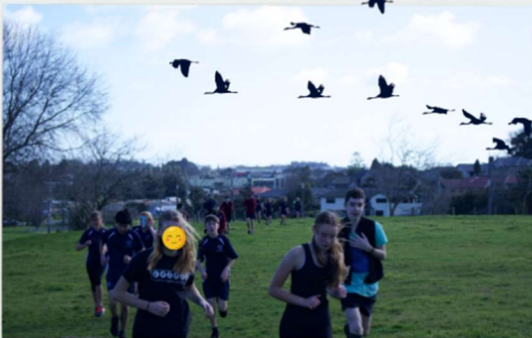

Dear parents, caregivers and students

We are a bit worried about the amount of uniform that ends up in the lost property bin at the end of the day. Over weekends, we collect multiple items left lying around school. These items include anything from jumpers to lunch boxes (still full), dinks bottles, bags, files, jewellery and most alarming of all is when things like expensive music instruments are left on the deck by the lost property bin for days before they are collected. Please have a stock take with your student to see if they are missing any property, encourage them to check the bin regularly. Please also make sure that the items, specifically clothing items, your student brings home is their property and not mistakenly mixed up with someone else's property after PE. Some students come to look for their lost property but don't find it because it is unmarked. We urge you to please clearly mark the property of your student so that in the event it is forgotten somewhere and put in the lost property bin, it will be easily identifiable and thus retrievable.
