We appreciate that space is limited when everyone is here at the same time, such as the end of the school day. To help address the congestion we have the following strategies in place:

- staggered end of the day for Primary at 2:50pm and Secondary at 3:00pm
- cars collecting primary aged students use the <u>upper carpark</u> and driveway spaces
- cars collecting secondary aged students use the lower carpark
- If there are no spaces available when you arrive, please aim for the lower carpark.

# **TEACHER WORKROOM UPGRADE**



# **QUINN CARPENTER – YEAR 6**

Quinn recently competed at the Gymnastics New Zealand National Championships in Tauranga. He was one of the team of four representing the Manukau region, which covers from Papatoetoe in the north across to Howick in the east and down to Franklin in the south. There are 4 gymnastics clubs in the region. To be selected in the Nationals team Quinn had to be one of the top 4 gymnasts at his level in

the region, competing in 4 local and 2 away competitions, the furthest away competition being in Christchurch.

To achieve this high level of accomplishment, he trains nearly 15 hours a week at Bruce Pulman Park in Takanini with a group of 5 other gymnasts, each at the same level as he is.

There are 10 gymnastics regions in New Zealand. The Gymsport Manukau team that Quinn was in came 3rd to get the bronze medal, quite an accomplishment against the 40 best gymnasts in the country for his level.




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
